

The member's draw convened by the comedy tag-team of Jack Press and Christian Roy continues to be a highlight of the night.


Each week the Tuesday Social starts at 4pm serving hors d'oeuvres. Our bar tenders usually come up with a specialty drink!



VISITING BOATERS

One the most rewarding things that we can do as volunteers at BQYC is to help visiting boaters at our Club's Reciprocal Dock. Many of us have done this – some for years – some for decades. Most of our visitors come from yacht clubs on the north shore of Lake Ontario but over time, boats from every yacht club on the south shore have found their way to BQYC as well. We have also hosted rare boats from Norway, Sweden, Florida, San Diego (a long story), Halifax, and Victoria B.C. All of our visitors have three things in common. They are nice people. They like to help. They all have stories to tell. Here are a three.

The Victoria visitors started their trip by heading south to the Baja, then north to circumnavigate Vancouver Island, land tug to Lake Superior, and then sail west to us. Somewhere between Toronto and BQYC, they met up with a retired NHL player alone on his maiden voyage in his newly-acquired 26' sailboat 'heading south'. The Victoria boaters helped him find Belleville. We encouraged the Toronto boater to equip his boat with a few things such as charts, life jacket, safety gear, storm gear, and dock lines before he headed south on his retirement adventure. The Victoria boaters promised to keep an eye on him at least as far as Oswego.

The Florida visitors came as a group. Three trawlers from Miami on their way to Sandusky Yacht Club, Michigan. The wives insisted that they there was no way that they were going back to Miami until the Cougars (not the animal) had left their beach-front condos.

Numerous Toronto boats visit us on the way to and from the Islands every year. One boating family from Toronto visited us several years in a row; Mom, Dad, and two preteen kids. Both parents were blind. Two little girls from Manhattan were sent by their mother to Toronto, met their grandfather and sailed with him to our Club dock - in the aftermath of 911 – safe with their grandfather -safe in Canada. And then there's our regular Toronto visitor Ted – solo sailor – Dawn's favourite – who finally revealed in a sailing magazine recently that he is 91 years old.

BANK ACCOUNTS CLARIFIED

When we receive campaigned donations, sponsorships and grants from members, community members and foundations it is crucial that these monies be used specifically for identified projects and never for club operating expenses. It is for this reason that a separate account held within BQYC holds these funds and are dispersed solely for the purposes as received. As treasurer and as a board as a whole all money received by BQYC goes directly to intended purposes. This is no different than the separate account also held within BQYC to hold funds for capital improvements from initiation fees collected. It is critical to our success as an organization that capital donations, sponsorships and grant funds are separated from operational. The race team receives sponsorship funds to support the team and these funds are held within the donation program and accounted for by the Sail Training Committee and by the treasurer and by the board, and ultimately the membership with audited statements. MONEY MATTERS



To effectively lead a club the board of directors must not only have a vision but it must have collaboration among themselves and with the members. When this happens good things become the focus of our energy, and in turn events held become successful and successful events means financial soundness. We are on the right track! We have a great start to a great year!

Directors have expressed a desire to keep cost reflective of our needs while improving our capacity for growth. On the social side there have been many wonderful dinners prepared and served by our members which have been well attended. Kudos to all the hosts and chefs who have diligently not only kept costs down but generated income to support club expenses. A tremendous effort by Wayne Peterson and Sue Jordan developed a planning sheet that enables each host to consider all associated cost which helps them budget and set pricing accordingly.

There is always going to be a high demand for upkeep and for future expansion of club activities. Our dues, storage fees, sail training programs, racing programs and social events contribute to the bottom line.

With member input the sail training committee is undertaking a huge project to improve the dinghy launch area, facilities, regatta capacity and fleet management. It all takes money, but this group has taken a keen interest through grant and foundation applications which if we are successful will help take some of the financial burden off of us. And, the improvements will help secure our future in dinghy sailing school, training and racing. That being said, it is important to show potential funders that we, as members, are supporting our initiatives.

The Sail Canada charitable tax receipt donation program has been renewed for 2016 and this year a goal has been set for \$20,000 to purchase a safety coach and training boat for the sail training programs. Sail Training (formerly referred to as the sailing school) encompasses the adult and family learn to sail program, the junior sailing school and camps, the dinghy race training program and race team, and the open dinghy regattas held most Saturdays throughout the summer.

Great things happen when we work together - we look forward to your contribution! Every dollar helps as we share the cost!

2016 DONATION CAMPAIGN UNDERWAY!

The excitement of receiving confirmation from the Parrott Foundation Grant for \$100,000 is fresh in our minds, and we couldn't be more thrilled for BQYC! The application was successful in part because of your contributions and support received in 2015. Together, we are making a difference!

In February, your input on the dinghy launch area was instrumental in allowing the Sail Training Committee to assess all ideas and put this in a framework for ongoing funding and growth. An Ontario Trillium Foundation grant has also been submitted as we publish this newsletter. We are looking forward to their positive reply.

Foundations like to see organization members participating in their own fundraising efforts to supplement grant requests. For 2016 our campaign has been set at \$20,000 for the upgrade and purchase of a stable, safe and reliable sail training coach safety boat and motor. This will be used for all our sailing programs and regattas for youth. This safety boat will be used for numerous activities at the club. We hope to have the

funds raised for implementation by the beginning of summer of 2016.

The charitable receipt tax program is again through Sail Canada; forms were mailed to everyone, are available at the bar and online at www.sailing.ca – Please make sure to highlight this is for BQYC so that we receive your contribution. Sail Canada will issue you a tax receipt.

PARROT FUND GRANT ANNOUNCEMENT



Your Board of Directors is very excited to announce that, through the efforts of the ongoing Dinghy and Sail Training Committee Fundraising Campaign, BQYC has been successful in receiving a significant donation from the Parrott Foundation in the amount of \$100,000. These funds will be directed toward Dinghy and Sail Training capital projects and will have a tremendous immediate and ongoing benefit to BQYC, it's membership and the local community.

The Board and Committee would like to reiterate its appreciation to members who have previously donated to this project. Your generosity and show of support to the Project in 2015 has been instrumental to achieving this additional fundraising success.

The demonstration of this local support from the Parrott Foundation will also enable BQYC to pursue additional funding from other regional and provincial sources and the committee intends to submit its application for funding to the Ontario Trillium Foundation this week. The results of the Trillium application will be known by the beginning of July.

These funds along with your ongoing support in our 2016 BQYC Donation Campaign through Sail Canada will enable us to address our needs and priorities for:

- adequate and safe safety/coach boats
- improvements to ensure a safe and adequate dinghy launch
- fleet maintenance and upgrades
- other related equipment and infrastructure
