

Bill 154 has passed and the **Ontario Not-for-Profit Corporations Act (ONCA)** is scheduled to be proclaimed in early 2020. Not-for-profits like BQYC will then have 3 years to comply.

What does this mean to us at BQYC? Not that much in our day-to-day operation. We will continue Racing on Wednesdays and Members Night will still be Fridays!

What we will need to do is revise our Constitution, Bylaws, & Policies to conform to the Act. Actually, we are already in pretty good shape. Ian in the role of Vice in 2018 did a lot of work on our policies. We also have ongoing help from Ontario Sailing (**Lisa Roddie**) who has reviewed our club documentation.

It will mean changing things like Financial statements being required 21 days prior to the AGM (instead of 10 days) and mapping our existing board names to the Act. (ie Commodore = President). We will clean up where things are documented and remove duplication. We also need to be very specific on what being a member means and the classification of memberships. There is more to it than that, but you get the general idea.

The plan is to work towards compliance in our documentation in the first half of 2020 with revisions ready for final membership approval at the fall AGM. I intend to form a committee to review markups and help with wording. If this is your forte, please drop me a line if you would like to be involved in review.
