












2016 MEMBERS DONATION CAMPAIGN

BQYC RECEIVES \$6300 FROM CANADA SUMMER JOBS

Good news, BQYC! We applied to "Canada Summer Jobs 2016", a federally funding jobs initiative for students, and received \$6300 to hire two additional full- time students. These additional students will become fully qualified CANSail instructors while being mentored by the senior instructors. Additional duties will include repairs and maintenance of the fleet, establishment of standard teaching documents for dry-land and on-water training, organization of learning regattas, and organization/ improvement of the training room and equipment sheds. They will also work to continue improving their sailing and leadership skills to become our future senior instructors and race coaches.

MOIRA S.S. STUDENTS UNDERTAKE SHOP PROJECT FOR **BQYC**



The Grade 11/12 Manufacturing class at Moira Secondary School have spent the school year manufacturing new tillers and dollies for the BQYC Laser fleet. The team of 8 students did the design, material sourcing and fabrication and were led by their teacher, club member and Shark sailor Aaron Gray (Grey Hound).

The tillers were manufactured with a precision machined aluminum rudder connection and thin walled aluminum tube that replaces the rather dated original wood tillers that came with the boats. The new tillers provide a much more secure and responsive connection with the rudder and weigh half what the old tillers do.

The dollies were manufactured using light weight aluminum square tube that have been painstakingly welded together. Welding such a thin walled aluminum frame is particularly challenging and the students gained an appreciation for the challenges of welding a material with a high melting point and high thermal conductivity.

BQYC and particularly the members of the dinghy fleet wish to thank Aaron Gray and his team of students for the fantastic and professional job.

RADIO CONTROLLED MODEL YACHT RACING



The Bay of Quinte Yacht Club is fortunate in that it has the almost perfect location for Radio Controlled Model Yacht Racing. A race course can be set anywhere from the entrance to the docks, around the south point, to the Moira River, dealing with almost any wind condition.

So what exactly is this "model yacht racing"? Well, first you race from shore and use radio to control the sheeting and helming of the models. So there is little chance of you getting wet or cold!

There is no handicapping as the models are built to a strict class rules and will be equally competitive. Winning is determined by the boat's set up for the wind conditions and the skill of the skipper. And, of course, like all racing, getting lucky helps too!

Courses are standard windward leeward and may include a triangle. All the usual racing rules apply. The starts are a one minute count down using a recording. And you get a similar adrenaline rush as in regular yacht racing!

The models we race at BQYC are the "Mini 12". The design is based on the classic 12 Meter Yacht. The hull is fibre glass and uses lead shot and epoxy for the internal keel weight. LOA 45 inches, displace-



ment 16 pounds and draft 8 1/4 inches. Sloop rigged with mast 52 inches height. Good used Mini 12s sell from between \$300 to \$400, about half the cost of building a new one.

Racing takes place every Tuesday from beginning of May until the end of October at 1:30pm, except during July and August when start is 6:00pm. Spectators, and any one interested in joining us are welcomed.

Strategically planning for improvements upwards to \$300,000 the team is diligently applying to applicable foundation and government grants. Completion of each "phase" will happen as funding becomes available.

Continuing with our successful member donations campaign of 2015, the complementary "2016 Membership Donation Campaign" is an integral and necessary component for securing foundation and grant funding. Organizations like to see members contributing financially towards the projects and goals, since we all benefit. The goal this year for member contributions is \$20,000 and to date \$7,200 has been received. Thank you!

Please consider making a donation; every dollar helps us attain our goal and aids in the probability of future funding. The improvements are for members' children and grandchildren, the community and the future of our club. Our partnership with Sail Canada has been instrumental in assisting BQYC to receive funds and donations, and issue charitable tax receipts directly to you.
