The Laser Mid-Winter Regatta was held in Clearwater Florida on the weekend of 23-25 February. It is the USA/Canada Pre-Olympic/Olympic qualifying race. Kyle Sudds raced in Laser, Daniel Escudero in Gold Fleet Laser Radial and Amaya Escudero made her debut in Laser 4.7. All these sailors were instructors/students at our summer camp last year. This is a must attend event for Canadians and Americans who wish to advance to higher levels of racing. Kyle Sudds' goal is to make the Ontario Sailing Team.

Andreas Steinitz has just finished a very busy month of March competing with Team Canada in Optimist. The first week in March saw him in Puerta Vallarta with Coach Fede, where he podiumed to third place in the Wesmex Mexican Nationals. This week, Andreas returned from Montevideo, Uruguay, from the Optimist South American Opti Championships. Andreas sailed well into Silver fleet with a top 10 finish in the initial gualifiers.

"A member hauling or launching a boat as part of the Club's annual lift who does not, on or before the established registration dates, pay or make arrangements for payment of lift fees with the lift committee member responsible for collecting such fees, will be subject to a penalty of \$50.00 in addition to the payment of the usual fees. In addition to the penalty noted above, the member's boat may, at the discretion of the lift committee, be relocated to a different boat storage position in the current or future year, or placed at the bottom of a waiting list for storage if the Club's property cannot accommodate all storage requests."

THE DOWNBURST OF '91 By Susan Smith PC Club Historian

It's April and Lift in is on the horizon. The story of possibly the most challenging Lift in BQYC's history seems appropriate. On March 28, 1991 a massive "Downburst" struck BQYC and knocked 23 boats off their cradles and did extensive damage to the clubhouse and grounds. High winds cut a swath across the tip of Victoria Park in the early hours of that Thursday morning, however Trenton's weather bureau denied claims that it was a tornado instead

calling it a "Downburst". It started with a massive clap of thunder which was heard throughout the city and was followed by heavy rains and high winds. Small boats were flung over 500 feet, a small Nutshell was thrown across the harbour ending up in the radio station parking lot, the covered patio was destroyed and much of the club roof was gone. Twenty three boats were knocked off their cradles, some

with extensive and many with superficial and cosmetic damage.

Difficult times bring about a shared concern for others and this event was an excellent example of the caring of the boating community and BQYC members. Many members of the boating community rallied together to help our club in our time of need. Members from yacht clubs around Lake Ontario, both in Canada and the USA called to offer their support. Members of Ontario clubs arrived at BQYC with food for the volunteers, offers of help and support over the days that followed. The emergency lift that weekend was a challenge as several boats were leaning on neighbouring boats and there was concern

about a domino effect. The lift was long and tiring but went smoothly under the

leadership of Trevor Waller and Les Ash with a multitude of volunteers who gave up their Easter weekend to help.
