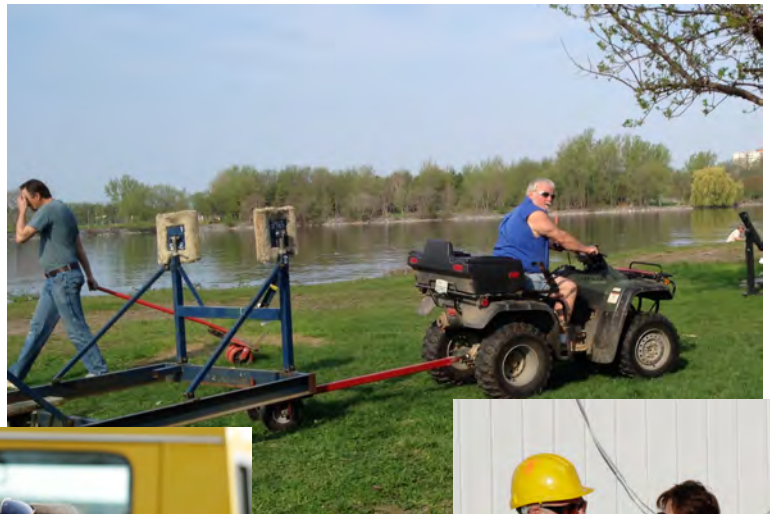


## FLEET CAPTAIN POWER ~ CRUISE UPDATE ~ EGON WENZLAFF

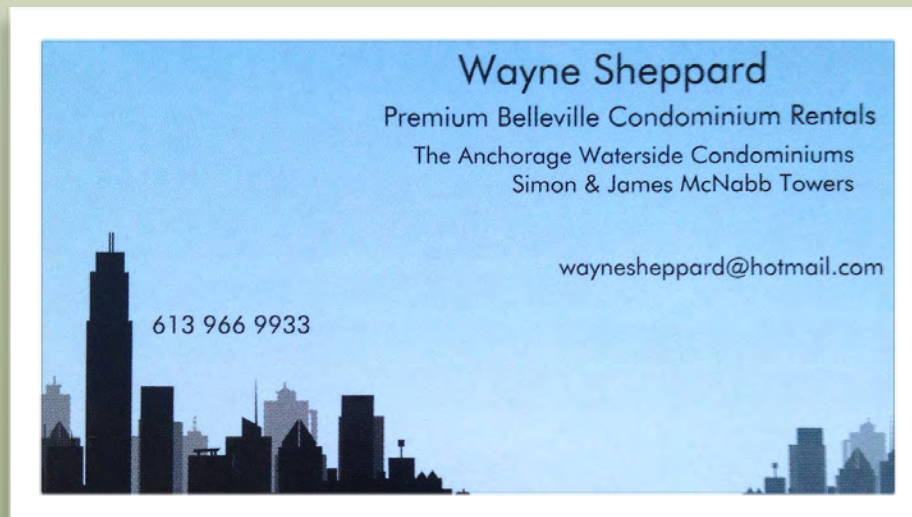

# BQYC'S OPTI PROJECT

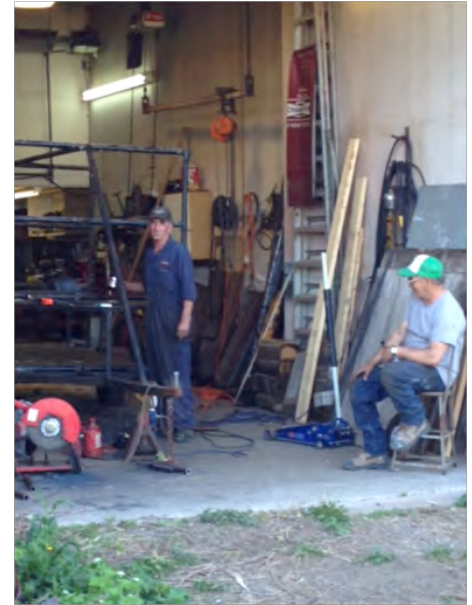


## What is an Opti?

The **Opti**, short for **Optimist** is a small, single-handed sailing dinghy intended for use by children up to the age of 15. Most boats are usually made of fibreglass, although wooden boats are still built. As one of the most popular sailing dinghies in the world, over 150,000 boats are officially registered with the class while many more have been built but never registered. The **Opti** is recognized as an international class by the ISF.

## Opti Building Project

A group of dedicated members and individuals have started an Opti building project for the benefit of the youth at BQYC. Suffering through a very cold winter, they began their trek of building Optis for BQYC. A great deal of time has been spent making templates for the future building of Optis and the first boat in production is nearing completion.



The **Opti** construction team is comprised of Ted King, Nathan Bressett and Dan Steinitz. A race team trailer is also under construction. This trailer, which will help bring racers to regattas, is designed to hold 4 Opti's and one Laser. The volunteer fabricators are Cecil Farrington and Dick Kaekstra.

### FREEMAN BURROWS: The man behind the name.

Freeman was a great sailor whose name is on nearly every trophy in the BQYC trophy cabinet. Many pictures of him and his boats over the years can be found on the walls of the BQYC dining room. The Bay of Quinte was not the only place where he demonstrated racing excellence. He raced all over Lake Ontario winning many trophies at the annual Lake Yacht Racing Association (LYRA) regatta (go to [lyrawaters.org](http://lyrawaters.org)), the largest and oldest regatta on Lake Ontario. Freeman loved the water and boating, continually encouraging and assisting people to use the Bay and the Lake for any kind of water and boating related recreation. Competition and sportsmanship defined his attitude to racing.

After Freeman's death, the Burrows Regatta was organized in his memory by some of his crew who sailed with him in their teens. The purpose of the regatta was to bring your family, friends, learn to sail students, out to race and have a good time. Expose people the beauty and fun of the water.

The hallmark of the regatta is the Freeman Burrows Trophy, the overall award for the person who has contributed the most to encouraging and helping people become involved in the sport of sailing. Seven years ago, it became the Burrows Hospice Regatta, a way to help others through the sport of sailing.

### **MONEY MATTERS**

As with any business or non-profit organization the financial health determines whether the company is viable, sustainable or stable.

The finance committee, under the leadership of Ted King last year, began a serious review of our finances, analyzing the programs and activities at BQYC to determine where net gain needed to be increased. This committee further identified the lack of a marketing plan, and recommended a director position specifically responsible for marketing and promotion of the club including the development of a recruitment and retention program. This continues to be a major detriment in moving ourselves forward. Our membership numbers simply do not support the costs to operate the club, nor provide a surplus for reserves necessary for capital improvement projects and renovations.

This finance committee also reviewed the SWOT analysis that had been completed in 2013, and then developed a strategic planning framework that was endorsed by the board in April 2014. With the development of a strategic planning committee in 2015, this document was provided and should assist in the advancement of future planning.

While there has been concern on the finances of our club, I can assure you that I am paying particular attention to the details that affect our capacity now and as we plan for the future. I am an advocate of sound financial management, and doing the books gives me the insight needed.

I mentioned last issue that part of good financial management is to look at whether or not contracts and supplier rates are competitive, and reflective of our needs. This has now been completed with all suppliers and as each contract comes up for renewal - to date \$7600 has been trimmed from operating costs, and will continue on an annual basis.

Three areas that plague us though are the costs we pay to the City of Belleville, insurance rates and auditing fees. Well over \$20,000 is paid annually for land lease, municipal taxes and the rental dock lease. Our insurance is \$14,000 and auditing fees approximately \$6,500. There is no legislated requirement for formal audits, except as required through our Constitution. Worth noting is that under the Ontario Not for Profit Corporation Act (ONCA) <http://www.sse.gov.on.ca> [that the provincial

government plans to bring in force some time in 2016], for organizations with less than \$500,000 in annual revenue, the act specifically addresses that audits and reviews are not required. Our annual revenue is approximately \$250,000.

When we reflect on where additional income comes from, entertainment and bar sales are closely linked and especially so with the additional events, thanks to Wanda and Terry these past few months where we saw an increase of over \$2,000 in bar sales! Member Friday Night Dinners are great successes with ticket and bar sales. A big thank you to all the chefs! Fleet Captain Sail events and EYC are shaping up nicely! The Sailing School with ambitious committee members with vision has resulted in 25 adult learn to sail students (ALTS), which is above its target. With the advent of the High Performance Race Team, the donation (charitable tax receipt) program to purchase an Opti and Laser fleet is well underway. The sponsorship program to support the youth racers is right on track, and registrations are flowing in for the summer camps. With lift-in just completed revenue and expenses are being analyzed.

All in all with thoughtful and careful spending, increased activities and opportunities for member participation and budgets that are generating surpluses we are beginning to see results. I invite you to contact me on any matter of finances. I welcome input with ideas. If you see an area where we can improve and have viable solutions please bring them to my attention. Thank you. *Kathy Graham*

# REGATTA SAFETY OFFICER TRAINING ~ JUNE 6-7, 2015

**This Regatta Safety Officer Training Program was developed to enhance the experience of competitors at regattas.**

It has evolved from a system of practices developed at CORK and has proven to work efficiently and effectively. References to CORK throughout this course are for examples only.

The course is sponsored by Ontario Sailing, CORK / Sail Kingston and Kingston Yacht Club. It will be conducted over two days and result in certification.

The Certificate will be recognized and provided by Ontario Sailing. Successful completion of the theoretical training on Saturday and the Sunday, on- water practical session, will provide the participants with two of the three steps toward a Regatta Safety Officer Certificate.

Volunteering as an Assistant Regatta Safety Officer at a pre-approved regatta, will complete the process which will result in a Safety Officer Certificate. Participants must register through the Ontario Sailing Website and pay the participant fee of \$103.96. This fee includes a printed safety manual written by Geoff Webster.

The in-class theory session will be conducted at Kingston Yacht Club Saturday June 6<sup>th</sup>, 2015 beginning at 9:00. Lunch menu will be available at KYC. 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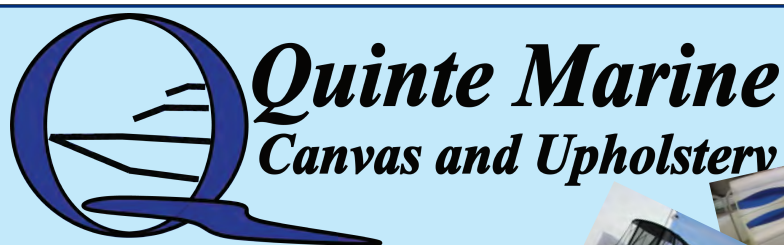

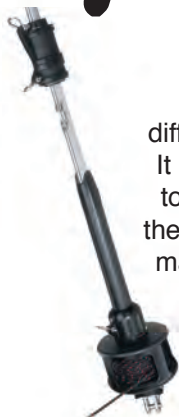
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
