

Membership Report Year End 2019

We are almost to the membership levels of past years so we are holding ground. We have 266 members in relation 270+ in previous years. I would like to compliment our Marketing Director for a great job and the wonderful publicity we have been receiving this year. We have been receiving a few membership inquiries from people shopping around and from outside the Quinte area, it seems we are in a prime location and with our lease finalized, opportunities are opening for us.

When I took over in February we were in the midst of issuing membership cards the process for creating cards involved a cloud based system. This has been changed to a totally PC based system so there is no membership information in the cloud. The process is simplified and documented. There are 2 themes you will read through this report the first data protection, the second simplicity so the task can be taken over and not be a burdensome job.



The next task was a Directory which was last produced in 2017, it was suggested to me a 2019 version be produced. The format could remain the same but thinking of a) keeping it more current with membership changes b) cost and c) being very aware of what fraudsters do with the personal information such as name, address and phone number thought maybe experiment with change. The current format was sent to the Board for feedback and then to you the membership, with only 2 very minor requests. Some things would stay the same, for those of you who have joined us in previous years: Price will include transportation on comfortable, warm, bathroom-equipped coach bus, and admission to show (unless you choose otherwise) as well as driver's tip. (Best part, besides traveling with a great bunch of people, is getting into a warm bus instead of a cold car at the end of a long day!)

Bus would leave BQYC at 10 a.m. and Trenton (Rona) shortly after if interest warrants. Returns at 10 p.m. There would be a 50-50 draw, and door prizes on the bus. Profits go to the Chris Waller Fund, which pays for underprivileged children to attend BQYC Sailing School. We would stop at the Mandarin in Pickering (always a HUGE hit!) en route home. Paid by individual at the time; cost is about \$26 which includes gratuity, tip, and a (non-alcoholic) beverage.

CHANGES

- 1. The bus company now demands full payment at time of booking. That means I will be requiring payment from passengers earlier than in previous years. (If it is looking like this will be a go, then further details on how to pay will be forthcoming.)
- 2. Price for bus and admission will be approximately \$55-65 per person. The price will drop if numbers permit. We will need about 30 people committed/paid before it will be a go.
